Call to order: Lynn Harrington calls the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.
Lynn Harrington requests to amend the agenda by moving Tactical Laser Tag speaker Keith DiBuono up to speak and present immediately after Public Comment.

Motion to accept amended agenda: made by Rufus deRham, seconded by Michael Perkins, carried unanimously.
Motion to approve minutes from the regular Park \& Recreation Commission Meeting held on 02.22.2022: made by Blythe Everett, seconded by Rufus deRham, carried unanimously.

## New \& Old Business:

- Youth Tactical Laser Tag
- Keith DiBuono of Frist Person sports makes a presentation for running a joint Tactical Laser Tag program in coordination with Dover, NY Parks \& Recreation. The program will be split with half of the matches taking place in Dover and half in Kent. Program will be open to children in $6^{\text {th }}$ through $8^{\text {th }}$ grade.
- Motion to run Tactical Laser Tag (as a fee program) in conjunction with the Town of Dover, NY: made by John Grant, seconded by Rufus deRham, carried unanimously.
- USTA Tennis in the Park Program
- Julia Neff reports that the USTA has been unable to find any coaches for the program and that we will have to run the program as an "autumn only" program due the unavailability of coaches in the spring.
- Youth Baseball \& Softball Update
- Jared Kuczenski reports the results of the Youth Baseball \& Softball Survey sent out to Kent families and made recommendations on how to run the program based on those results.
- Jared Kuczenski also reports that we will need to purchase new equipment to run this program due to having outdated equipment. He expects that this will cost several hundred dollars.
- Motion to run Youth Baseball \& Softball with all in-house programs charged at a rate of $\$ 20$ per child and all "Region 1" programs charged at a rate of $\$ 25$ per child: made by Abigail Smith Hanby, seconded by Kate Symonds, carried unanimously after discussion.

## 2022 YOUTH BASEBALL \& SOFTBALL PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

PRE-SCHOOL: Start Smart Tee-Ball Clinic - This 6-week skill development clinic is based purely on fun and is a great way to introduce your child to the sport of baseball! Sessions last around 40 minutes and will take place on Wednesdays from 5:20p to 6:00p at the Kent Center School. Start date is to be determined. Please note that this program requires parents to participate with their children! Don't worry, you'll have fun too! COST: \$XX.XX

K - $\mathbf{1}^{\text {st }}$ GRADE: Tee-Ball - This 8 -week instructional program is a great way for kids to learn the sport of baseball while also getting the opportunity to participate in small-sided tee-ball games! Practices and games last around 1 hour and will take place at the Kent Center School. Start date as well as program days and times are currently to be determined. Please note that volunteers are needed to coach in this program! COST: \$XX.XX
$\mathbf{2}^{\text {nd }}-\mathbf{3}^{\text {rd }}$ GRADE: Farm League (coach pitch) - This 8-week instructional program is a great way for kids to learn the sport of baseball while also getting the opportunity to participate in small-sided coach-pitched games! Practices and games last around $11 / 2$ hours and will take place at the Kent Center School. Start date as well as program days and times are currently to be determined. BASEBALL $4^{\text {th }}-6^{\text {th }}$ GRADE: Minor League (player pitch) - This program is the first level of player-pitched, umpire-called baseball for children. Practices and/or games generally takes place twice a week beginning in late-April and ending in late-May. Children will playing with other Region 1 participants and thus the location of this program is to be determined. Players are broken into teams as numbers allow and practices are complimented with weekly games. Please note that volunteers are needed to coach in this program! COST: \$XX.XX

Dear Jared,

What FPS is proposing is to facilitate a Kent Recreation hosted branch of our TLT League (Tactical Laser Tag League)

We will run a 6 week program consisting of 2 sessions each one hour on Mondays from 4-6pm. This first season would be in partnership with Dover Parks and Recreation. As such, we would hold half of the sessions on Dover Park Properties, and the other half at Kent CT Park Properties. As we discussed this would be for players grades $6^{\text {th }}$ through $8^{\text {th }}$ for the first season.

FPS will field and run each event providing referee staff and equipment for each league session. FPS will provide Kent Rec with Artwork and copy to advertise the program.

FPS is agreeing to run this season for an "unknown payday" amount...this means that we are not requiring a guarantee of minimum payment amounts for this first season. We will work along side you to try to develop this program and see that it is successful. For our first season we propose starting the season fees at $\$ 130$ per player for the season. The League will provide a team neck gaiter as the team designations for each player. The league requires the payment for the league season to be paid up front so the payment is due on the opening day of the season. The league runs this as a shared revenue with the town, out of the $\$ 130$ the league will pay Kent $\$ 30$ per player. If payment is not possible by the first day we do allow a two week extension but the shared revenue drops to $\$ 20$ per player.

We look forward to working with you and the town of Kent as this program becomes something special and most importantly FUN for the kids of the Kent School District.
