I am requesting that a $2^{\text {nd }}$. Resident Trooper and Resource officer be added to the Town's Budget this coming year. Over fifty years ago, I was the only Resident Trooper in Kent and served for seven years. The town has grown considerably the last fifty years. During the 1980s' when Maureen Brady was First Selectman we had two Resident Troopers.

We need seven day coverage and a $2^{\text {nd }}$. Trooper would provide this coverage. The two of them would also be available as a First Responder. Presently at this time to my knowledge our Resident Trooper does not work weekends. He is only one person and does an excellent job with criminal investigations that are time consuming. The State Police has one Trooper assigned to three towns on weekends, one of which is Kent. Police manuals recommend that there be one police officer for every one thousand residents in a community.

Route \# 341, \# 7, South Kent Road and our other town roads encounter speeding on a regular basis from motor vehicles and motor cycles by several miles per hour exceeding the posted speed limits.

Crime, Traffic and Security for our town and schools must be a priority so please address these important two issues, Resource Officer \& $2^{\text {nd }}$. Resident Trooper and add them to the budget.

12. Provide written evaluation and/or verbal group evaluation of counselors by June 8 of each year.

# Town of Kent Memorandum of Understanding 

December 22, 2023

Whereas the Town of Kent is in the process of searching for a permanent Park and Recreation Director and the current director, Jared Kuczenski, has offered to provide a limited number of hours for remote administrative tasks during this interim period before a new director is hired, the Kent Park and Recreation Commission asks the Kent Board of Selectmen to hire him as a part-time program aide as outlined in this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). This would allow Kent residents of all ages to continue to participate in programs and events as they've come to expect in recent years and provide a continuity of service.

It should also be noted that a canvassing of the Park and Recreation Commissioners on Monday, December 18, 2023 revealed that the volunteers do not feel they have the time or expertise to handle administrative tasks previously accomplished by the director and would prefer not to hire an interim director position. The commission has established a Director Search Committee and work is already underway to select candidates for the permanent director role and set up interviews.

It should be noted that volunteers on the Commission will be required to step in and provide in-person help in a number of areas during this interim period and the Commission is working on a plan to make sure all of the needs are covered.

## Proposal:

Jared Kuczenski is hired to work an average of 8 hours per week at a rate of $\$ 29.42$ per hour for a period of time until the next director is hired, which is expected during the next two months (January and February). All of the work would be remote and be administrative.

## Examples of tasks:

## Communication:

Answering phone calls and emails that are sent to Park and Rec and addressing questions. or directing them to the Chairman for a response.

## Programs:

Setting up and collecting fees/registrations online for the previously-approved programs for January (including Adult Open Swim, Adult Water Aerobics, Adult Mindful Yoga, Open Skate and Sticks and Pucks Skating, Youth Ski Program at Mohawk, Youth Learn to Skate and Hockey Development, Youth Basketball and any other ongoing programs). This also includes developing posters and distributing emails on the programs and posting on Facebook to alert potential participants of the available programs. Communicating with instructors/coaches, as well as payment of instructors and associated record-keeping would also be included in these tasks

## Senior Activities:

Coordinating with Social Service's Samantha Hasenflue and Rosemary Jones, to ensure continuation of senior programming and the related tasks involved with the programming, including volunteer coverage and necessary supplies.

## Personnel:

Coordinating with Program Aides and Volunteers to ensure adequate staffing at all the programs and events that occur during this interim period. Arranging for payment of Program Aides (and any other paid personnel) with the town treasurer. Communicate with ASP Director to ensure that the program is operating smoothly.

Mr. Kuczenski agrees to note a summary of tasks completed when submitting his online timesheet and regularly communicate with Park and Recreation Commissioner/Selectman Lyṇn Worthington throughout this period covered by this agreement.

This MOU would end February 29, unless both parties agree to an extension of up to 30 days.
