# SWIFT HOUSE TASK FORCE MOTION TO BE READ AT BOARD OF SELECTMAN'S MEETING on 5/19/22:

We, the Swift House Task Force subcommittee of the Kent Board of Selectmen, respectfully request that the Board of Selectmen resolve all outstanding issues currently impeding the full or partial reopening of Swift House for continued use by the Kent Chamber of Commerce and Kent Garden Club, in particular, and by others as appropriate, by the next regular Board of Selectmen's meeting on June 2<sup>nd</sup>, and to facilitate that objective by:

- Consulting with an authorized ADA Coordinator trained to explain ADA rules, interpret requirements, and advise on whether immediate implementation is necessary, or not, and by
- Investigating possible extension of Town's liability insurance to cover complementary use of Swift House by Kent's civic organizations for membership meetings, work sessions, and other gatherings not open to the public, or by grants to those organizations to cover the cost of liability insurance, if necessary.

It should be noted that the issues regarding ADA regulations and liability coverage have been pending since early February, and those affected would be grateful for a speedy resolution.

# Zanne added:

"Both the Garden Club and the Chamber of Commerce have no one that would be working or meeting in the building that is handicapped, so there really is no need for handicap facilities for these two groups."

Town Attorney recommendation:

- To consult with an ADA fluent architect to determine precisely what modifications can feasibly, reasonably and economically can be made to achieve ADA compliance, so as to avoid inadvertent non-compliance.
- CIRMA recommendation:
  - Non-governmental entity, would not be covered by the Towns liability policy.
- Jean reached out to CIRMA to ask them if the Town could pay for a nongovernmental entity's liability insurance.
- Jean will reach out to Joe Manley to see if he would be interested in being the ADA Coordinator for the Town of Kent.
- We have communications from Randy saying, we should not open this building until we get the details worked out.
- Would love to find another solution for the Garden Club, and I think that we can
  pretty easily find a temporary solution for the Garden Club.

# Town of Kent Main Street Noise and Traffic Sub-Committee Initial Report for Board of Selectmen Adopted on May 17, 2022, at a duly warned meeting via Zoom

By all accounts the traffic is heavier in Kent than ever before and by extension, the volume of cars, motorcycles, cyclists, mopeds and pedestrians has increased both speed and congestion. Downtown's elevated activity and din spawned our subcommittee to take a hard look at the Noise and Traffic in the center of Kent.

Traffic laws are not being obeyed; it is that simple. While drivers are ultimately the problem, renewed efforts to control traffic through signage and enforcement is critical. There are two separate entities in our area with the oversight of each part of the challenge: Department of Transportation (D.O.T.) and the State Police, respectively.

The D.O.T's rationale and process in setting speed limits, signage, traffic signals and crosswalks have been the subcommittee's initial focus. The soon-to-be launched Streetscape project provides the B.O.S. the opportunity to work with D.O.T. in making substantive modifications during the build out.

Admittedly, there have been a number of traffic studies on the traffic in the village of Kent with detailed statistics of traffic accidents and volume and speed. This report is drafted with a more organic perspective from individuals who live, work, and navigate town on a daily basis. Eye witness accounts of numerous traffic infractions—from the mundane to the dangerous—is what the subcommittee is hoping to share. This has been a concern for a long time (see GTD article attached).

Here are our Recommendations, Observations & Rationale, focused on the areas in which Connecticut D.O.T. can be of assistance. A further report will be furnished regarding this subcommittee's recommendations regarding enforcement and public education.

### Recommendations:

- Village Zone:
  - A. Expand the Village Zone beyond the present location.
- II. <u>Village Speed Limit:</u>
  - A. Reduce Speed Limit to <u>25 Miles Per Hour</u> in the new Village Zone.
- III. <u>Traffic Liaht & Crosswalks:</u>
  - A. Install "No Turn on Red" and "Yield" Signs at the traffic light
  - B. Increase the traffic light crosswalk timing to 30 seconds.
  - C. Reinstate the Safety Pylons in all Village Zone crosswalks.
- IV. School Areas:
  - A. Institute a School Zone Area on Rte. 341 west of intersection.

<u>Observations</u>: Over the last 30 years, the speed limit in the village has not changed despite contributing factors that have made the village busier beyond even the "high season days". The reasons are substantially due to:

<u>Population</u>: Tourism, Kent School/Marvelwood School, and Pandemic transplants have intensified their use of the village, increasing the demand for different and higher-trafficked establishments.

<u>Development</u>: The village of Kent has appropriately expanded along the Rte. 341/Rte. 7 axis with either new, expanded, or more intensive uses such as:

- Expansion of Kent Greenhouse
- South Commons Housing
- Farmers Market
- o Kent Firehouse
- o Kent Barns
- Library Book Sale all summer long
- Kent School Pre-Engineering Building
- o Increase from 8 food establishments to 12 (13 counting the seasonal hot dog vendor)

<u>Historic Development</u>: Northeast of the traffic light, the historic buildings are charming, but the dense commercial area's proximity to the traffic light significantly contributes to the congestion as people seek to park, navigate through the light, or cross Main Street on foot. Additionally, the beloved Civil War Monument poses visual and traffic challenges, making this intersection a non-traditional interchange.

## **IA. Village Zone Expansion Rationale**

### Rte. 7 South



<u>Existing</u> - This straightaway entices people to pick up speed either leaving town or entering. Farmers Market, South Commons, and Kent Greenhouse can generate considerable traffic entering Rte. 7. <u>Recommend</u> - Moving the Village Limits sign further south to encourage traffic to slow down prior to any private entrance onto Rte. 7.

Rte. 7 North



<u>Existing</u> - This section of the road is where a 13 home subdivision has been approved, potentially adding 24 more cars entering Rte. 7 with frequency. The speed limit is 40 MPH where this housing will intersect with Rte 7.

<u>Recommend</u> - Move the speed limit sign north to just after Sloane Stanley Museum. This will encourage drivers to slow down while ascending the hill prior to the entrance of Cobble Lane.

Rte. 341 East



<u>Existing</u> - Heading into the Village, the speed limit is not posted until after the entrances to the Transfer Station, The Kent, and Town Garage. The Firehouse, Templeton Farms, and residences also access Rte. 7 here

The 2016 Road Safety Audit (RSA) (p. 24), notes: "High speeds for westbound traffic on Maple Street and limited sight distance are a concern."

**Recommend** - Place Village Zone marker across from Dr. Hetson's (dental) office.


Rte. 341 West





<u>Existing</u> - Straightaway and blind corner is a high risk area. A motorcycle vs. car accident occurred after a Kent School sporting event. Speed limit is confusing as there are 25 MPH and 35 MPH signs before the main entrance to Kent School.

**Recommend** - Establish Village Zone just after Schaghticoke Road where Kent Welcome sign is.



## **II. Village Zone Speed Reduction**

Existing- The Speed Limit in the Village is 30 MPH on Rte. 7 North and South and 35 MPH on Rte. 341 East and West.

**Recommend** - Village speed limit of 25 mph in all directions.

- 1. Area Village Limits vary: Sherman and Torrington currently have 25mph speed limits.
- 2. Kent has as dense a traffic flow as Torrington and is more dense than Sherman from all directions.
  - a. from West: Kent School has numerous intersections with high volumes of children walking to town, sports and class. Elizabeth Street is the access point to Kent Center School and has a high volume of buses, cars, and children daily.
  - b. from East: KVFD and Town Garage introduce large, slow moving vehicles onto Rte. 341
  - c. from South: Kent Greenhouse and South Commons are heavily used intersections.
  - d. from North: The Village Center has the highest amount of vehicular and pedestrian traffic but within a smaller footprint than Torrington and Sherman.

## III Traffic Light and Crosswalk Rationale:

### Intersection of CT State Routes 7 and 341

A. <u>Improve signage</u> to keep intersection clear for turning trucks/equipment.

<u>Existing</u> - one "stop here on red" sign for Westbound traffic on Rt 341. The intersection's acute angles makes it difficult for large vehicles to turn, especially if other drivers are creeping forward to see to make right turns on red.

### Recommend-

- 1. Add "No Turn On Red" on Eastbound Rt 341 to prevent drivers from creeping into the crosswalk or encroaching on the intersection to see beyond the Monument.
- 2. Add "No Turn On Red" on Northbound Rt 7 to avoid encroachment on the crosswalk or impediment to large vehicles turning from Rt 341.
- 3. Add "No Turn On Red" on Westbound Rt 341

**2016 RSA (p. 24) suggested,** "consider installing No Turn on Red signs at the intersection of Route 7 and Route 341," in order to increase safety of motorists and pedestrians due to limited sight lines at intersection.

4. Install "yield" sign at the right turn from Southbound Rt 7 to Westbound Rt 341 (there was once a yield sign here)

5. Add lead signal phase for left turns from southbound Rt 7

2016 RSA (p. 29) suggested "adding a new lead signal phase for the southbound North Main Street approach to accommodate left-turning vehicles" to improve flow of traffic on North Main St.

## B. <u>Increase light crossing time</u>

Existing - Pedestrian crosswalk time is 17 seconds, per 2016 RSA.

<u>Recommend</u> - Increasing time to 30 seconds. This is a no- to low-cost strategy that can be implemented quickly and has many benefits (as reported in 2016 RSA).

The pedestrian crosswalk is a "protected cross" with all vehicular traffic stopping at the same time when the cross signal (white walking person) is lit. Traversing the intersection's crosswalks is a challenge due to the distance of:

- 1. Crossing 341, (Bridge) west side of intersection = 35 feet
- 2. Crossing 341, (Maple) east side of intersection = 38 feet
- 3. Crossing 7, (S Main) south side of intersection = 31 feet
- 4. Distance from SW corner to the actual cross walk (crossing Bridge) on west side of intersection = 101 feet
- 5. Hypotenuse between SW and NE corners = 94 feet

Many elect to cross on the hypotenuse from the SW corner to the NE corner, bypassing the crosswalks on S Main St and Maple St in order to cross with enough time during one walk cycle. By increasing the walk time to 30 seconds, we will:

- decrease the number of times vehicle traffic is stopped by pedestrians having to push the walk button again to continue on to the next crosswalk
- 2. decrease the likelihood that people will cross on the diagonal hypotenuse because they will be able to safely cross within already-designated painted crosswalks within longer timeframe
- 3. improve safety for all pedestrians, especially those who may have slower ambulation speeds.
  - Kent has older residents (many live SE of the intersection at the Templeton Farms) and other visitors and residents (young families and older people) who may need to cross slower, but are still

within normal ranges of Limited Community
Ambulators

- ii. Community Ambulators
  - 1. >0.8 m/sec gait speed (>2.62 ft/sec)
  - 2. Negotiate curbs, sidestepping obstacles (people, signs, animals, strollers)
- iii. Limited Community Ambulators
  - 1. 0.4 0.8 m/sec gait speed (1.31-2.62 ft/sec)
  - 2. Are still able to walk on uneven surfaces and negotiate ramps, but may need an assistive device (walker, rollator) or physical assistance (hand-hold)
- iv. Slowest rate of expected populations that would use the crosswalk (1.31 ft/sec) multiplied by longest distance (38 feet crossing Maple St) = 29 seconds

Special considerations of Kent populations and actual use by residents/tourists

- 1. Limited community ambulator populations
  - a. High incidence of Geriatric population (Kent's median age in 2019 is 54.0 years)
  - b. People with strollers and very young children
- 2. Residents (students and young families)
- 3. Visitors with families
- 4. Kent School students (and staff/families) walking into town from school
- 5. Kent Center School students walking home from school
- 6. Actual use of the intersection crosswalks: on hypotenuse between SW and NE corners = crossing 2 lengths of intersection at once.

### All Village Crosswalks (Except for the Traffic Light)

C. Reinstate Crosswalk Safety Pylons

<u>Existing</u> - No visual aid in crosswalks. These were removed by B.O.S. concerned about liability, repair, and scheduling challenges for the program.

**Recommend** - Reinstituting the Crosswalk Safety Pylons program.

- 1. Effective visual notification for vehicles especially on busy days. Has been proven a useful crosswalk aid.
- 2. Provide a Town employee to place and remove 8am-8pm during summer hours
- 3. Monitor and upgrade/replace when degraded.

## **IV School Zone Rationale:**

<u>Existing</u> - Kent School and Kent Center School are both located west of the intersection on Rte. 341 generating considerable pedestrian and vehicular traffic 35 MPH is the posted Speed Limit. Coming into town (traveling east), prior to Kent School's main entrance, a 25 mph Side Road Left sign is posted 30 yards before a 35 mph Speed Limit sign.

Traveling west on Rte. 341, passing St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, there is a 35 mph Speed Limit sign posted 30 yards before a School Zone Pedestrian Crosswalk sign.

## **Recommend:**

A. Designate a <u>Non Regulatory School Zone</u> on Rte. 341 west as per the Division of Traffic Engineering Guidelines <u>Section 3.25</u> - School Zone Signing

B. Establish 25 MPH as the posted School Zone Speed Limit

Section 3,25 - School Zone Signing

According to the MUTCD, a school is defined as "a public or private educational institution recognized by the State education authority for one or more grades K through 12 or as otherwise defined by the State." The narrative below describes four different treatments for school signing.

- 1. A "School Zone Ahead Fines Doubled" zone
- 2. A "School Speed Limit XX mph When Flashing" zone
- 3. A combination "School Zone Ahead Fines Doubled" and a "School Speed Limit XX mph When Flashing" zone
- 4. A Non-Regulatory School zone warning

The first three are regulatory in nature and therefore, require approval by the Office of the State Traffic Administration (OSTA) prior to field implementation. The fourth treatment involves the installation of school warning (non-regulatory) signs.

SCHOOL SPEED LIMITS IN SCHOOL ZONES: These can be established on state roads after an investigation by the Division of Traffic Engineering and approval by the OSTA, or local roads after an investigation and approval by the OSTA. The regulatory speed limit which is approved by the OSTA is in effect during school

hours when the lights attached to the sign assembly are flashing. The school plate is black and fluorescent yellow-green and the speed limit sign is black and white.

In summary, pedestrian and vehicular safety in the Village of Kent can be improved with the implementation of a few key measures :

- 1. Expanding the Village Zone beyond the present location;
- 2. Reducing Speed Limit to 25 Miles Per Hour in the new Village Zone;
- 3. Increasing the traffic light crosswalk timing to 30 seconds;
- 4. Installing "No Turn on Red" and "Yield" Signs at the traffic light.
- 5. Reinstating the Safety Pylons in all Village Zone crosswalks;
- 6. Instituting a School Zone Area on Rte. 341 west of intersection.
