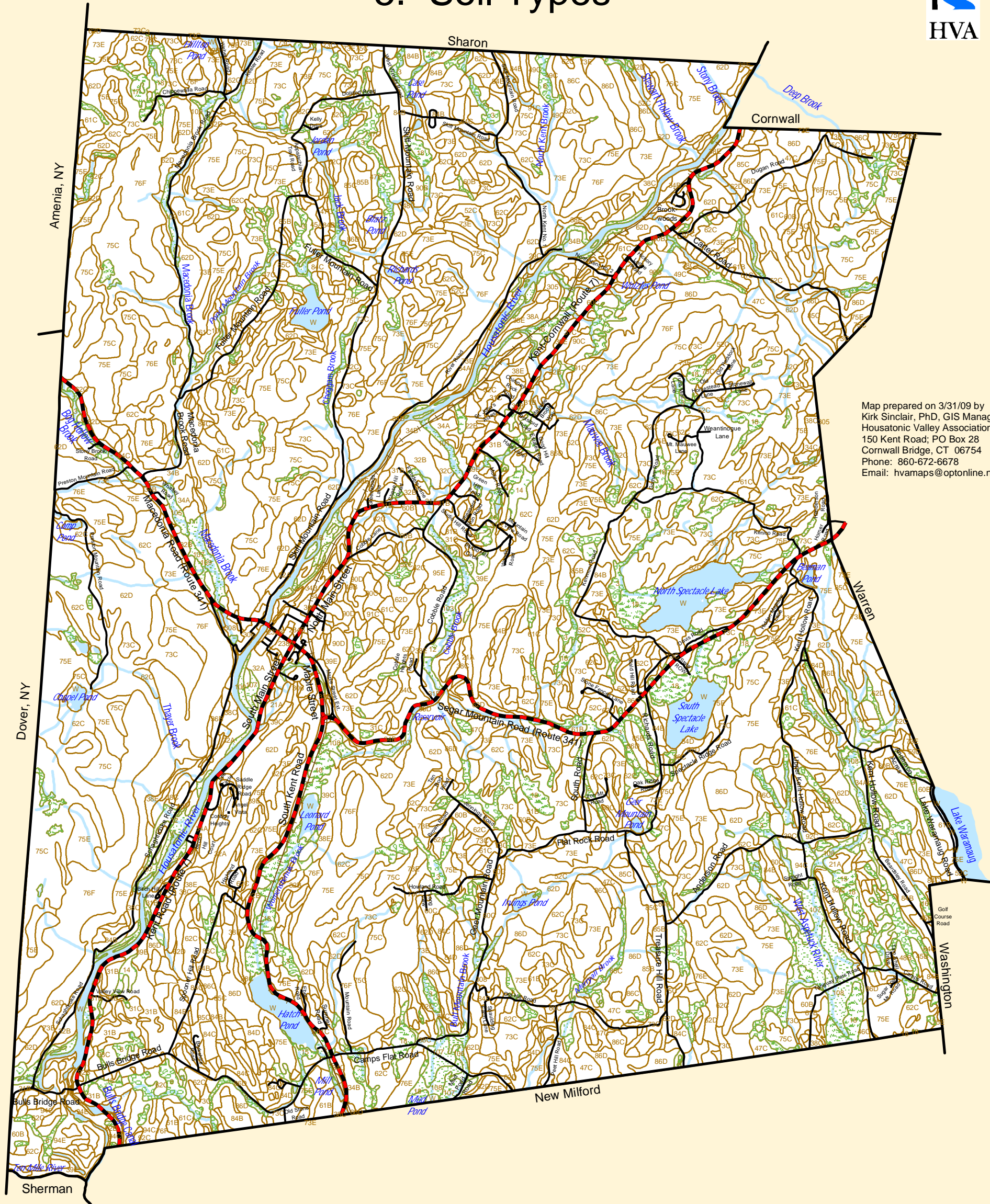
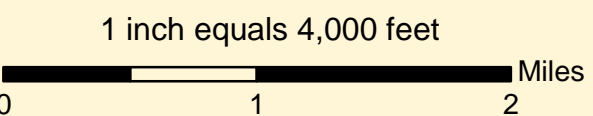

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DATA SOURCES
Most data were obtained from the Environmental GIS Data distributed by the Connecticut DEP. Roads, lakes, and streams are based on USGS DLG files. Road data were enhanced through the use of GPS, digital orthophotos, and town review. Soils are from the USDA/NRCS Web Soil Survey of 2005. Minimum soil unit size is 3 acres.

Minimum size of labeled map units is 10 acres. For descriptions of soil units see the addendum of Kent's Natural Resource Inventory.
