

COVID19 UPDATE 3



Good Afternoon,

Yesterday, in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes, I declared a State of Emergency and Local Civil Preparedness Emergency for the Town of Kent.

This declaration aligns the Town with the declarations at both the State and Federal levels, and gives us to access necessary resources during the emergency. It will also allow us to apply for future reimbursement from the State and Federal governments, should funding be allocated.

Local-level information and links

A few local updates:

- The Kent Emergency Operations Center, located at Town Hall, continues to be manned from 1300-1600 daily.
- We have made the decision to close the Welcome Center.
- Davis IGA remains open and has <u>online ordering</u> for pickup and delivery.
- All restaurants are take-away only. Please consider ordering from a local restaurant.
- All Town buildings, Kent Memorial Library, and the KVFD Firehouse remain closed to the public.
- The UPS dropoff at the House of Books is unavailable due to their closure, but there is a UPS drop-box behind Webster bank.

• We have been contacted by the CT Food Hub and will be participating in a food dropoff program they are standing up. We will keep you posted on this.

We continue to be in regular contact with the schools, fire and EMS officials, Torrington Area Health Department, and businesses to discuss planning going forward.

I've been participating in numerous conference calls with our state and regional emergency management and public health partners. They are working with their state agencies to ensure continued access to food & provisions, PPE for emergency responders, and healthcare options such as telehealth.

We are working on activating our Everbridge Emergency Notification System, which is a robust system that can reach all households in our town. While this newsletter is delivered to almost 1200 email inboxes, Everbridge has the capability to send messages including voice messages and text messages to home and cell phones, and even send a fax to a fax machine. We hope to send a town wide message in the coming days.
