During the campaign, I proposed the idea of having bi-monthly meetings of the Board of Selectmen, and at our November meeting, the new board agreed to this idea. As we approach the end of 2021, I wish that rising COVID numbers weren't a factor in this holiday season. As of today, however, the positivity rate in Connecticut has jumped to 8.3% (see below for more information). By now, we know what we need to do to keep each other safe and protected from the virus. As of today, the state's coronavirus positivity rate has jumped to 8.3%. For the past two weeks, the positivity rate has been between 5% and 6% and as hospitalizations have been on the rise. Governor Ned Lamont announced today that hospitalizations were over 500. This jump comes as concerns have been raised over the omicron variant, which was detected in the state over the weekend.

Last Monday, Governor Lamont released a statement regarding the emergence of the SARS-CoV-2 variant B.1.1.529, also known as the Omicron variant:

"Earlier this year we set up a network of labs, coordinated by the Connecticut Department of Public Health, that are conducting genomic sequencing on positive test specimens to provide understanding of the variants circulating in Connecticut. Our advance planning in this area will help us track Omicron, in addition to other variants that could appear in the future.

"The best defense against COVID-19 is a good offense. This news of the Omicron variant reminds us about the importance of being vaccinated and getting a booster. We have now entered the winter holiday season and still need to mask while in indoor public places, practice proper hand hygiene, get tested, and stay home if you feel sick. That cold may be more than just a cold. It is particularly important to take extra precautions when visiting with older or immune-compromised friends or family who are at higher risk from COVID.

"There's a reason why Connecticut has garnered national recognition during this pandemic and that's because of our residents. With your help, we will get through this next stage, as well."

- No appointment needed
- PCR test results available in 24-48 hours
- CT residency is *not* required
- Insurance is *not* required
- Must have an email address to get test results
- Priority lane for First Responders

Mondays and Thursdays I 4:00-7:00p I until further notice

### **Did You Know?**



A new seatbelt law went into effect on October 1: all vehicle passengers- including those riding in rear seats- are now required to wear a seatbelt. Pre-existing law only required rear-seat passengers under 16 to buckle up, even though proper restraint use is effective for all ages. Between 2017 and 2020, there were more than 12,589 injuries of rear seat occupants in Connecticut. During this same period, there were 61 fatalities. Read more on the State of Connecticut website.

## **Town Updates**

**Birch Hill:** There continues to be no updates regarding the proposed 85-bed substance use disorder treatment facility on the property at 46 Maple Street. The Town of Kent continues to monitor developments.

**Streetscape:** The Town has received one of three permanent easements needed to move the project forward. The last two (from the same property owner) should be in hand soon. I am happy to report that grant funding has been extended for the project.


Federal Tribal Recognition: Currently, there are no updates to report.


**Cell Tower Construction:** Homeland Towers has received approval for their Development & Management Plan and plan to have the tower up by summer of 2022. What does this mean for Kent?

The tower facility will provide reliable wireless communications services to the central portion of Kent, along Segar Mountain Road (route 341), Richards Road, and in surrounding areas. In addition, AT&T will be providing FirstNet services, which is the first broadband network dedicated to emergency services (police, firefighters, and emergency medical services). Plan documents can be found on the **Docket 488 page** on the Connecticut Siting Council website.

Before and after coverage maps (below) can be found in *Attachment 1: 'Statement of Public Need with Coverage Plots'*. Please note: two sites were initially proposed for consideration-Bald Hill Road and Richards Road. The tower will be constructed at 93 Richards Road, which is described in the second half of the *'Statement for Public Need'* report.
