Friends and neighbors,

I have some great news to report to you this month. After 14 years, three grants and multiple town meetings, our community is closer than ever to beginning the much-needed and long-awaited Village Streetscape Project.

Last month, The Board of Selectmen awarded the bid for Phase I of the Village Streetscape project, which will be concrete with granite curbing, to the The Mather Corporation. Earlier this week, I met with the team from Mather Corp. for a kickoff meeting and to sign the contract.

This project has come together after many years of discussion, design and decision-making. Over a dozen residents have volunteered their time serving on the multiple committees that have assisted the Board of Selectmen and the community get to this point. There is much more to come and we will update the community as Phase I gets underway.

Last Thursday evening, the Board of Finance held their annual public hearing on the budget for the public to have an opportunity to ask questions and provide comment. I presented major drivers for the BoS budget of \$13.6 million; the BoE presented highlights of their \$7.2 million budget. On May 20th, the budget will be voted on during the Annual Town Budget Meeting, which will be over Zoom due to rising COVID infection rates.

Lastly, you will notice the COVID-19 section in the newsletter has moved to the bottom; with the increase in cases across the state, it's important to stay informed so we will continue to include that section.



Federal Tribal Recognition: The Board of Selectmen met on Tuesday, March 29th to receive a report from special council on the status of the Schaghticoke Indian Tribe petition for federal acknowledgement.
