## **Civic Engagement**

## **Town Updates**

**Birch Hill:** There are no updates regarding the proposed 85-bed substance use disorder treatment facility on the property at 46 Maple Street. The Town of Kent continues to monitor developments.

**Cell Tower:** Homeland Towers, LLC, the company constructing a cell tower on Richards Road, has received CT Siting Council approval of its Development & Management Plan. The plan documents are available on the CT Siting Council website. Note: all documents are under the "Development & Management Plan (D&M Plan)" section at the bottom of the page.

**Primary Care in Kent**: We continue to have conversations with health care organizations across the state looking at options for solutions. There are trends to explore in rural healthcare that support implementing alternatives like telehealth and community paramedicine.

**Streetscape:** The final design documents are with the CT DOT for their review. This brings us closer to sending out the RFP bid packages. The committee will continue to meet as the summer progresses.

Tribal Recognition: Counsel to the Town of Kent continues to monitor the situation.
