Friends and neighbors,

Summer 2022 in Kent is in full swing - the village is busy with visitors, last night saw incredible weather for the first concert of the Summer Concert Series at the Kent Land Trust fields; the first session of the re-imagined Camp Kent - at its new location at Club Getaway - is providing families with an affordable and fun local day camp option.

Even in the summer months, your Town government is still hard at work. One example is the ARPA Needs Assessment Committee. They have worked for a year to assess the needs of the community in response to and to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic. They presented their recommendations at the last BoS meeting, and the board ratified their recommendation to distribute \$400,000 of the ARPA funding through a grant program to help community members respond and recover from the negative impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Town Treasurer Barbara Herbst is the program administrator, and an application process was launched on July 1st for those eligible to receive funding.

Tax Collector: A reminder from the Tax Collector - tax bills have gone out and are due in the month of July. NEW as of July 1, The Tax Collector's office can now accept and process credit card payments in the office.

Planning & Zoning: Plan of Conservation and Development: the Planning and Zoning Commission and the POCD subcommittee held an informational forum June 30th via zoom to hear comments from the public on the draft Plan of Conservation and Development. Details and the draft document can be found on the town website.

Affordable Housing Plan: The steering committee held a second community forum on June 22nd. To view the recording and presentations, visit the <u>Steering Committee page</u> on the Town website. Using the data collected, discussion and public feedback, the committee will begin to draft a plan.

Birch Hill: There continues to be no updates regarding the proposed 85-bed substance use disorder treatment facility on the property at 46 Maple Street. The Town of Kent continues to monitor developments.

Cell Tower Construction: The tower has gone up, and Homeland Towers anticipates completion within the next few months. Plan documents can be found on the <u>Docket 488 page</u> on the Connecticut Siting Council website.

Federal Tribal Recognition: The Town has submitted comments on <u>Petition #401</u> Schaghticoke Indian Tribe (SIT, CT).

Streetscape Village Improvements Phase I: The Mather Corporation is planning to begin construction on Phase I of the Streetscape project in early August, beginning on Bridge Street to take advantage of decreased foot traffic due to schools being out for the summer months, and increased pedestrian and vehicular traffic on North Main Street during the busier summer shopping season. Once Bridge Street is completed, they will begin the North Main Street section beginning at the northern end of the village working south. We will share information - and any changes - as the workplan details are finalized.

Did You Know?

...that you can - and really should - report your bear sightings? The Wildlife Division of the Connecticut Department of Energy and Wildlife Protection is conducting a long-term study of the state's growing black bear population. Some bears have been marked with ear tags and GPS collars as part of their research. Sighting reports provide important insight about the distribution and



abundance of bears throughout the state, while also providing information about any conflicts or concerns.

Report bear and other wildlife sightings on the DEEP website, and check out a map of current sightings for black bears, bobcats, and moose in the State. Please share this information (and my personal bear story from last summer, with DEEP tips for how to keep the balance with bears) - it's important we have a true number of just how many bears are in our community!

COVID-19 Updates

The COVID-19 vaccine is now available for children 6 months & older. The CDC recommends COVID-19 vaccines for everyone 6 months and older and boosters for everyone 5 years and older, if eligible. Use CDC's COVID-19 booster tool to learn if and when children and teens can get boosters to stay up to date with their COVID-19 vaccines.

The COVID-19 Community Level in Litchfield County continues to be MEDIUM. Residents are encouraged to keep an eye on community levels through the CDC website, both locally and in areas you may be traveling to. Wear a mask if recommended, including people with symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID-19.

Home test kits and masks continue to be available to Kent residents at the Town Hall. Masks are in the front lobby and kits can be picked up in the First Selectman's Office. Please take advantage of drive-through testing at the Transfer Station and continue to stay smart when protecting your health and others.
