


News Worth Sharing: COVID Info | Senior Lunch | FOI Meeting

December 31, 2021



The news about COVID-19 remains extremely concerning, with the statewide daily case rate at over 20%.

At-Home COVID-19 test kits: Kent Emergency Management has been notified by our State partners that we will be receiving a limited supply of At-Home kits for distribution to priority groups including first responders. We will share information as soon as plans are in place. This continues to be a fluid situation.

Testing Continues: Free COVID-19 testing is available at the Town of Kent Transfer Station.

- FREE drive-through testing is open to all
- No appointment needed
- PCR test results available in 24-48 hours
- CT residency is *not* required
- Insurance is *not* required
- Must have an email address to get test results
- Priority lane for First Responders
