Income Tax Preparation Assistance: (Sites are open late January/early February, 2019) AARP Foundation Tax Aide offers free tax preparation help to anyone age 50 or older that cannot afford a tax preparation service. IRS –certified volunteers, provide one-on-one tax preparation assistance at area locations. The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program offers free tax help for low-to moderate-income (under \$50,000) people who cannot prepare their own tax returns. Prescription Drug Take-Back Day: The Northwest Corner Prevention Network in partnership with the Kent Resident State Trooper and state police at Troop B will host Prescription Drug Take-Back Saturday, April 27, 2019 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Kent Town Hall, 41 Kent Green Boulevard, Kent and Troop B barracks, Route 7 in North Canaan. Prevention Network representatives will hand out free lockbags designed to safeguard prescription medications in homes, as well as literature and other promotional materials. The event, held nationally twice yearly, provides families and community members with a free, safe and confidential way to dispose of unused and unwanted prescription drugs and medications. - 1. All requests for rides must be made through calls to the First Selectman's office at 860-927-4627. Please do not call drivers and schedulers directly. Please do not request specific drivers.
- 2. Rides within Kent are for medical appointments, shopping and other needs, such as hair appointments, trips to the Food Bank, etc. Rides outside of Kent are for medical appointments only.
- 3. Please call for a ride at least three days in advance of your appointment, or earlier, if possible. Rides are not provided on weekends or when Town Hall is closed.

# Town Business & Reminders

Energy Assistance Program (EA): Kent Social Services serves as a voluntary intake site for all Kent residents that qualify for EA. EA has specific gross income and asset limit requirements. Since the entire household benefits from this program, income and asset verification will be required for all adult household members. To determine if your household qualifies for this program or to schedule an appointment, contact Leah Pullaro, Kent Social Services 860-927-1586.

Real Estate Tax Relief: In 2012, the Town Meeting of Kent voted a resolution for a Tax Relief Program for Elderly and Disabled Homeowners (Sec. 18-9). In brief, those homeowners who are 65 years or older, totally disabled, or part of the Circuit Breaker Program may defer their real estate taxes on their primary residence. The Town will later collect these back taxes when the property is sold and/or is part of an estate settlement. Property owners with a reverse mortgage are not eligible. Applications for deferred tax relief shall be filed with the Assessor between February 1 and May 1. Applications are available in the Tax Assessor's office 860-927-3160. Renter's Rebate Program: If you are a senior 65+ or a person with a disability, and pay rent for an apartment, a cooperative, congregate housing, subsidized housing, or for a rooming house, you may be eligible for this program. The application period is April 1 to October 1, 2019. The rebate amount you may receive is based on a graduated income scale and the amount of rent and utility payments you made in the PRIOR year (2018). Income limits: single person \$36,000.00; married couple \$43,900. Those that apply must meet at least one of the following criteria: Individual or spouse must be 65 years of age or older as of December 31, 2018. Renter must be 50 years of age or older and the surviving spouse of a renter who at the time of death had qualified and was entitled to this program (provided the couple was living together at the time of death). Renter must be 18 years of age or older who is permanently and totally disabled under Social Security Disability guidelines. All Renters must have resided in the State of Connecticut for at least one year at any given time. To schedule an appointment, contact Leah Pullaro, Kent Social Services 860-927-1586.

Elderly and Totally Disabled Homeowners Program: Applications taken in the Assessor's Office from February 1, 2019 to May 15, 2019. Homeowner, or their spouse, has to be 65 years old as of December 31, 2018 and be the owner (or have life use) of the property as of October 1, 2018. If you are Social Security Totally Disabled there is no age requirement. Bring proof of income for the calendar year 2018. This includes a signed copy of your federal income tax return and the SSA-1099 Social Security form. If you do not have to file an income tax return, please bring all documents provided for 2018 income (interest, dividends, pensions, etc.). Income limits are \$36,000 for unmarried and \$43,900 for married for 2018. Income is your adjusted gross income PLUS untaxed social security benefits. Veterans who are receiving an exemption under section 12-81 of the CT General Statutes may also be eligible for an additional exemption provided the same income levels are me as outlined above. The Assessor's Office is open Mondays and Wednesdays from 9:00AM -12:00PM and 1:00PM to 4:00PM. If there are any questions you can contact the Assessor's Office at 860-927-3160.
