**Social Services:** A number of Social Services programs are supported by the work of Kent's amazing volunteers. If you are interested in volunteer opportunities to serve your community,

**Planning & Zoning - Plan of Conservation and Development:** The Planning and Zoning Commission will hold a public hearing on November 10th to hear comments from the public on the draft POCD. The draft document can be found on the <u>Town website</u>.

**Affordable Housing Plan:** The steering committee has completed their charge and the Town of Kent Housing Plan was approved by the Board of Selectmen and submitted to the State Office of Policy and Management. The approved plan is available on the <u>Steering Committee page</u> on the Town website.

**Birch Hill:** Plans are currently under review with the Land Use and Building departments to renovate the property into the proposed 85-bed substance use disorder treatment facility at 46 Maple Street. The Town of Kent continues to monitor developments.

**Cell Tower Construction:** The tower has gone up, and Homeland Towers is working on final implementation of the tower. They anticipate completion within the next couple of months. ### Do You Know...

**Governor Lamont has announced that farmers in all eight Connecticut counties are now eligible for federal disaster assistance due to drought.** <u>Read more</u>. Farmer operators interested in applying for assistance must contact the local <u>Farm Service Agency office</u> for their region. Farmers have eight months from the date of the declaration to apply for assistance.

### **COVID-19 Updates**

The COVID-19 Community Level in Litchfield County continues to be MEDIUM. Residents

are encouraged to keep an eye on community levels through the <u>CDC website</u>, both locally and in areas you may be traveling to. Wear a mask if recommended, including people with symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID-19.

#### The COVID-19 vaccine is now available for children 6 months & older. The CDC

recommends COVID-19 vaccines for everyone 6 months and older and boosters for everyone 5 years and older, if eligible. Use <u>CDC's COVID-19 booster tool</u> to learn if and when children and teens can get boosters to stay up to date with their COVID-19 vaccines.

#### **Home test kits and masks continue to be available to Kent residents at the Town Hall.** Masks are in the front lobby and kits can be picked up in the First Selectman's Office. Please take advantage of drive-through testing at the Transfer Station and continue to stay smart when protecting your health and others.
