
Q1 Are you familiar with the Swift House?



Q2 Did you know the Town of Kent owns the building and land?



Q3 Have you ever been to a meeting or event at Swift House?



Q4 Are you aware of past uses of the Swift House? Select all that apply.



Q5 Did you know that significant repairs have taken place in the last few years, including repairs to the foundation & chimneys, and a new roof?



Q6 Do you think the town of Kent has adequate public and private facilities for small & mid-size meetings and events?



Q7 Should the town continue to support necessary maintenance and repairs of this historic structure, including ADA accessibility?



Q8 Thinking about possible future use of the Swift House, please rank the following:



Why can't the lovely apartment upstairs be brought to code and the rental income be used to help support the building? Historical societies around the country have offered housing to young couples with restoration skills who maintain the building in exchange for reduced or no rent. The apartment could easily be for two people. Some have contracts such as no rent in exchange for 15 hours of labor per week. Perhaps this is too complex with municipal ownership and would be better arranged by a non-profit.

More information about the implications of using this for different purposes would have been helpful. For example, if we use it for additional town hall space in lieu of expanding the current town hall, would there be savings involved here? Also, there is a current community center/hall that seems to be in disrepair. More information on plans for that would be helpful when considering options for Swift House. Also: more information would be useful about the 'sell with deed restrictions' option. Might this be the highest and best use for Swift House if funds can be used for other public spaces while retaining some deed restrictions for the new purchaser?

What I thought was missing was information describing the disrepair and infestation that has been allowed to happen through failed disregard for the structure. I would love to see it restored but it will need a fairy godmother. This piece of information should have been included before tempting the emotional heartstrings.

Strongly support the use of The Swift House by The Chamber of Commerce.

It is time to take this building off the towns balance sheet. The money needed for its continued use could be much better spent in other areas of town- recreational facilities, community house upgrades, protecting our school with a resource officer, development of new facilities to house the above mentioned groups and clubs, and town hall expansion if needed.

Judging from the questions I receive at the book sale, new visitors to the town don't know all that is available to them. I think that Swift House, just as visitors arrive in the town, could provide information both about the background of the town and the current facilities we have, perhaps with a permanent exhibit that would not infringe upon the charming historic nature of the main room. This information center would involve a team to answer questions etc, but they would "be the face of Kent". The only difficulty I see is the lack of parking space directly around the building, and I would hate to have the yard around the house turned into a parking lot.

In lieu of selling the property, I would like to see it gifted to the Kent Historical Society, again with deed restrictions.

It is hard to answer the questions about maintaining v. selling without some probable cost information. It is also hard to say what uses would be appropriate without an understanding of the requirements and retrofit costs for the intended uses. The town should improve the Swift House to make it more attractive for both public and private use. The current town hall does not need to be expanded! The swift house could become more offices for town hall staff if it was renovated carefully. No one uses the Town Hall at all it seems expect the staff. It s a shame The current first selectman and the previous selectman do not seem to think the Town Hall should be opened to the public who paid for it! For example in the recent heat wave the library was used as a "cooling center" This makes no sense at all. Our town has a very poor record of owning and acquiring property. We basically own nothing much and the town leaders do nothing to plan or appropriate funds for acquisitions. The perfect example is the parcel North of Town (12 acres) that was sold so cheap (\$360k) and the town could have used it for playing fields or a community barn not 12 houses that the developers hope to sell for nearly a million dollars each! The same goes for the land next to the town hall that is for sale. Why doesn't the town buy it? There needs to be a acquisition community formed to be watch dogs for future town investments because our leaders don't think it is a priority! This will soon bite us back. Keep the Swift house. Preserve it and use it sensibly!

The Task Force might consider recommending that Swift House be deeded to the Kent Memorial Library to program activities and manage, which they do well, since there's no one currently on the Town's staff that seems interested or capable of effectively promoting its use. It would also be better for the Library not to have to raise as much money for such a large proposed expansion, duplicating space that's already available at Swift House. KLM would probably also take better care of Swift House than the Town has done historically, which seems to be dependent on who's in office and whether private citizens at any given time are urging the Town to be more responsible about the building's needs.

As long as the town owns the Swift House, it should be responsible for maintaining and repairing the structure. Whatever the survey results reveal, something has to be done to restore this house of historical significance. In its current state it just looks neglected. If town is to sell, it could become a residential property in a time of serious housing shortage. If town is to keep, major investments become necessary. I suggest to talk to the Kent Barns for good advice on how to revive the place. (I'm unaffiliated)

There is no parking there and to make the building ADA compliant for public use would be a huge cost to the tax payers of Kent. Kent is mainly a geriatric town making the Swift House difficult to use for many residents. The changes the building would endure to make it ADA compliant or turned into a residence would certainly alter its historic significance.

How much does it cost the town to maintain the building? How much would it sell for (with restrictive covenants to keep most of the historic character)?

Swift House is important part of the history of Kent with unique character. It is important to continue to preserve its buildings. I think the building gets visually overwhelmed by being right next to the gas station so any additional natural buffer between the 2 lots should be encouraged.

The Town desperately needs affordable housing, and at least two apartments could be created in Swift House, along with space for the small meetings described. That would also lead to public funding that could update the building much more effectively than the small budget the town can afford for "band aid" repairs--that would include good insulation, safe entry and stairs, efficient heating and cooling, energy saving appliances and solar panels. The building has long been underused, and patching it up for occasional meetings would not be the best use.

There are a lot of places that fill the niche for the uses proposed for the Swift House - the Kent Community House, the churches, the town hall. Selling it with some restrictions to preserve the exterior appearance would seem to make the most sense.

The Swift House has not proven to be needed by Kent organizations and should be sold.
