Jean Speck welcomed attendees and thanked them for attending. She introduced the Housing Plan Steering Committee members and planning consultant.


- J. Ayer then reviewed the **attached slides** with attendees including information about what will be included in this plan, the definition of dedicated affordable housing, and what housing needs the plan was trying to address.
- J. Potter said that the committee was considering a goal of creating 20 dedicated affordable homes over the next 5 years and asked the attendees if they supported that goal. The polling results are attached.




At the end of the forum there was time for questions and comments from attendees. One attendee noted that she was a recent first time homebuyer and that it was one thing to make people more aware of the programs intended to help first time homebuyers but another for them to actually be able to access those resources in a timely way when the market requires you to be able to act quickly. She also noted that the goals and strategies were not measurable or time bound. Another attendee noted that from a planning perspective encouraging housing in the village center areas which are served by public water and sewer made more sense. The committee was asked to consider the soil based zoning in the rural residential zone in town and how any proposed zoning changes might effect that.













3. Do you support the strategy of providing technical assistance for creating accessory apartments? (Single Choice) *
