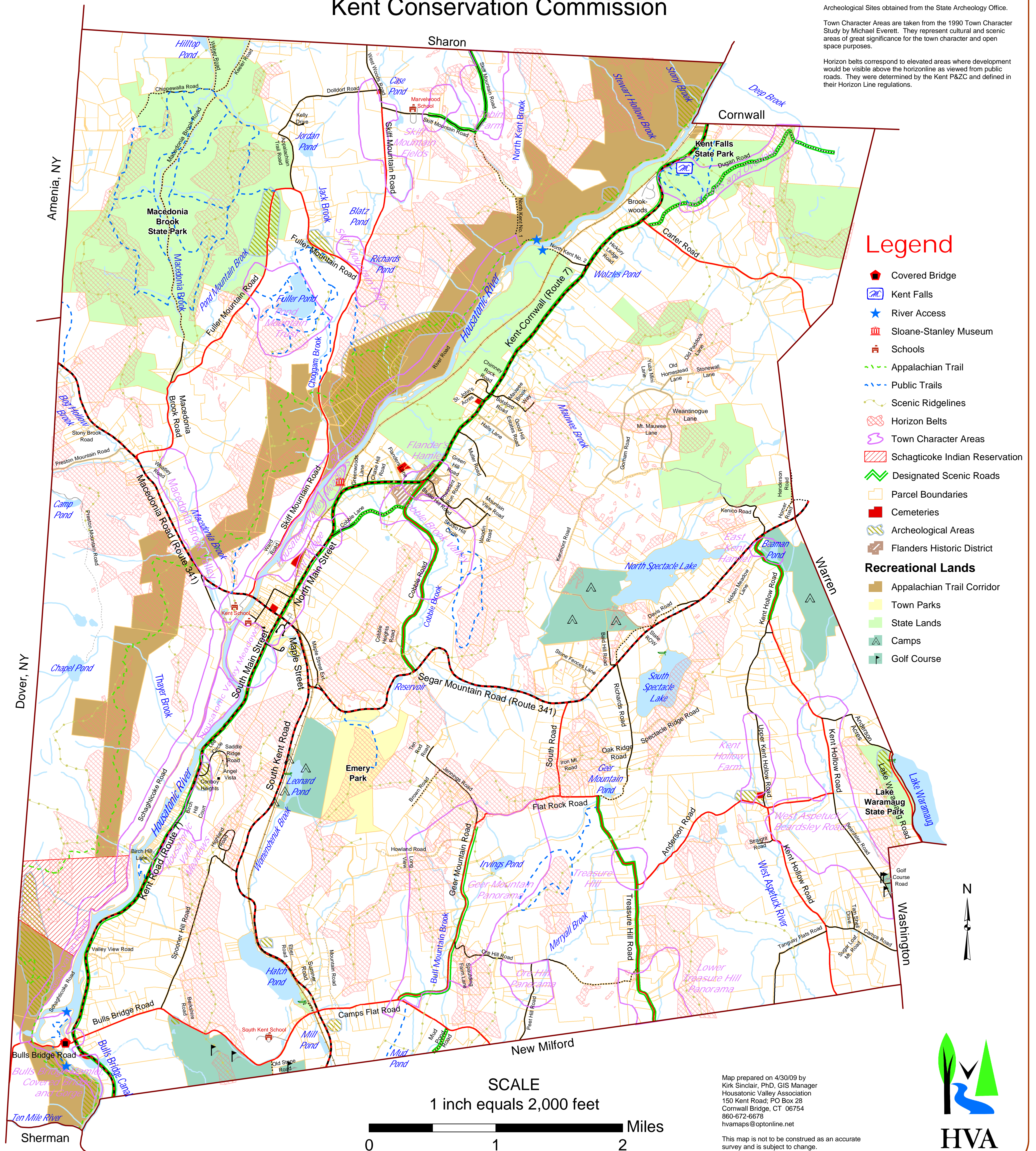
DATA SOURCES

Most data were obtained from the Environmental GIS Data distributed by the Connecticut DEP. Roads, lakes, and streams are based on USGS DLG files. Road data were enhanced through the use of GPS, digital orthophotos, and town review. The Appalachian Trail was obtained through the use of a GPS receiver with 2-5 meter positional accuracy.

Archeological Sites obtained from the State Archeology Office.

Town Character Areas are taken from the 1990 Town Character Study by Michael Everett. They represent cultural and scenic areas of great significance for the town character and open space purposes.

Horizon belts correspond to elevated areas where development would be visible above the horizonline as viewed from public roads. They were determined by the Kent P&ZC and defined in their Horizon Line regulations.
