Senior Workshop: Aging Gracefully

Aging Gracefully is a four part series presented in three sessions, May 16th, May23rd, and May 30th at 1:00p.m. Kent Senior Center, 1 Swifts Lane. Catherine Vlasto LCSW, Hospice Social Worker for New Milford VNA and Hospice will be presenting.

Topics include:

Emotional Ties to Clutter: If you hold onto every birthday card, paper drink umbrella, souvenir and inherited item, you might have an emotional tie to clutter. Join us for an interactive discussion about how to work through your feelings about your sentimental belongings. Discover the freedom of decluttering your life.

Five Wishes: The Five Wishes document is an advance directive that is often called a 'living will with a heart and soul' because it covers delicate conversations, such as how you want to be comforted, who you want as your caregivers, and specific situations to help you define what life support means to you. Participants will receive the document, review it in detail and Participants will be provided with the Five Wishes document and we will go over it in detail.

Challenges of New Beginnings: Have you found yourself in a new situation, such as taking a new class, or moving into a new area, or downsizing from your home or even becoming a widow or widower? Join us for a conversation about the challenges of new beginnings. Meet others in a similar situation and pick up a few tips that might help you manage these challenges.



Town Business & Reminders

Renter's Rebate Program: If you are a senior 65+ or a person with a disability, and pay rent or share rent for an apartment, a cooperative, congregate housing, subsidized housing, or for a rooming house, you may be eligible for this program. The application period is April 1 to October 1, 2018. The rebate amount you may receive is based on a graduated income scale and the amount of rent and utility payments you made in the PRIOR year (2017). Income limits: single person \$35,300.00; married couple \$43,000. Those that apply must meet at least one of the following criteria: Individual or spouse must be 65 years of age or older as of December 31, 2017. Renter must be 50 years of age or older and the surviving spouse of a renter who at the time of death had qualified and was entitled to this program (provided the couple was living together at the time of death). Renter must be 18 years of age or older who is permanently and totally disabled under Social Security Disability guidelines. All Renters must have resided in the State of Connecticut for at least one year at any given time. To schedule an appointment, contact Leah Pullaro, Kent Social Services 860-927-1586.

Transfer Station Permits: Town of Kent transfer station permit renewals will be mailed at the end of May. Permits are valid July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019. The cost of each permit is \$150.00 or \$130.00 for residents age 65 and older. The permit may be purchased at the First Selectman's Office Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 4 p.m. Residents also can mail completed forms (also available on the Town website: townofkentct.org) to The Town of Kent, P.O. Box 678, Kent, CT 06757. Please make checks payable to the Town of Kent and include a stamped, self-addressed envelope.

Dog Licenses: Pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §22-338, the owner of each dog over the age of six (6) months must license their dog(s) with the Office of the Town Clerk in the town of residence no later than the 30th of June each year. There is a \$1.00 per month late fee assessed for overdue licenses. Failure to license your dog(s) is punishable by a fine in the amount of \$75.00 per dog. The licensing fee is \$8.00 for each <u>spayed or neutered</u> dog and \$19.00 for each <u>unaltered</u> dog. To obtain the discounted license fee for newly spayed or neutered animals, owners must provide a copy of the spay/neuter certificate. If your dog's rabies vaccination expired after you licensed him/her last year, you must also provide a current rabies certificate in order to obtain a new license. Licenses may be obtained in person from the Kent Town Clerk's office during normal business hours; 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Monday - Thursday, and 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. on Fridays.
